The Board of Education recognizes their broad responsibility for providing for a course of study in the schools that is appropriate to the age and

1. review carefully any and all material to be distributed to students with the understanding that they will be responsible and accountable for all materials distributed; and
2. notify the Director of the Department in advance of the dissemination of any material likely to be considered controversial by staff, class or community.

The Chairperson will review the materials pursuant to the guidelines above.
